Minutes of the meeting on March 24, 2009

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 pm by President Bonnie Bock with approximately 15 people in attendance. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve the amended minutes of the Feb. '09 meeting. The Treasurer's report was given by Tammy Folkerts who stated we had a balance of \$14,600 and met our bull roast budget. Tammy said we made approximately \$4,500 with about 200 people in attendance. All agreed the food and band was awesome. Mark Held presented the money that was made from the sale of the inverters and suggested we buy a new generator with it. Sheri Provenza requested we set aside money for Indoor Guard registration early in the season, for better placement.

**Director's Report:** Bonnie reported that the directors wanted to congratulate the Indoor Guard on a great job. The guard has placed 1<sup>st</sup> in their competitions, prior to this past weekend. Sheri reported the Indoor Guard performed a flawless routine on March 21<sup>st</sup>. They came in 15<sup>th</sup> out of 30 groups in their first performance at the WGI regional championships. The next performance will be at the KIDA championships in Hanover, PA on March 28th. The parents preview show is March 26<sup>th</sup> here at the school.

Several options being considered include: use our current trailer after repairs are made, replace trailer with something similar remembering that we would still need a truck and someone to drive it, rent or purchase two smaller trailers that could be hauled by a large, parent driven, pickup truck, or get a smaller trailer that could be towed by a rented u-haul type truck and trailer. A discussion was also held regarding the possibility of the CCCTC diesel class maintaining, and thus storing a tractor and trailer. The committee will continue to investigate options.

Penny Lynch volunteered to be the executive board nominations chair person. She will gather names and present at the next meeting for President, Vice President, and Secretary. We will need a new Treasurer who is appointed by the President.
